Noon with **no vowel** over it written with a **sukoon sign** or without may occur **anywhere** in a word



Extra silent Noon
Written in **different** forms occur always at **the end** of words .

الإدغام

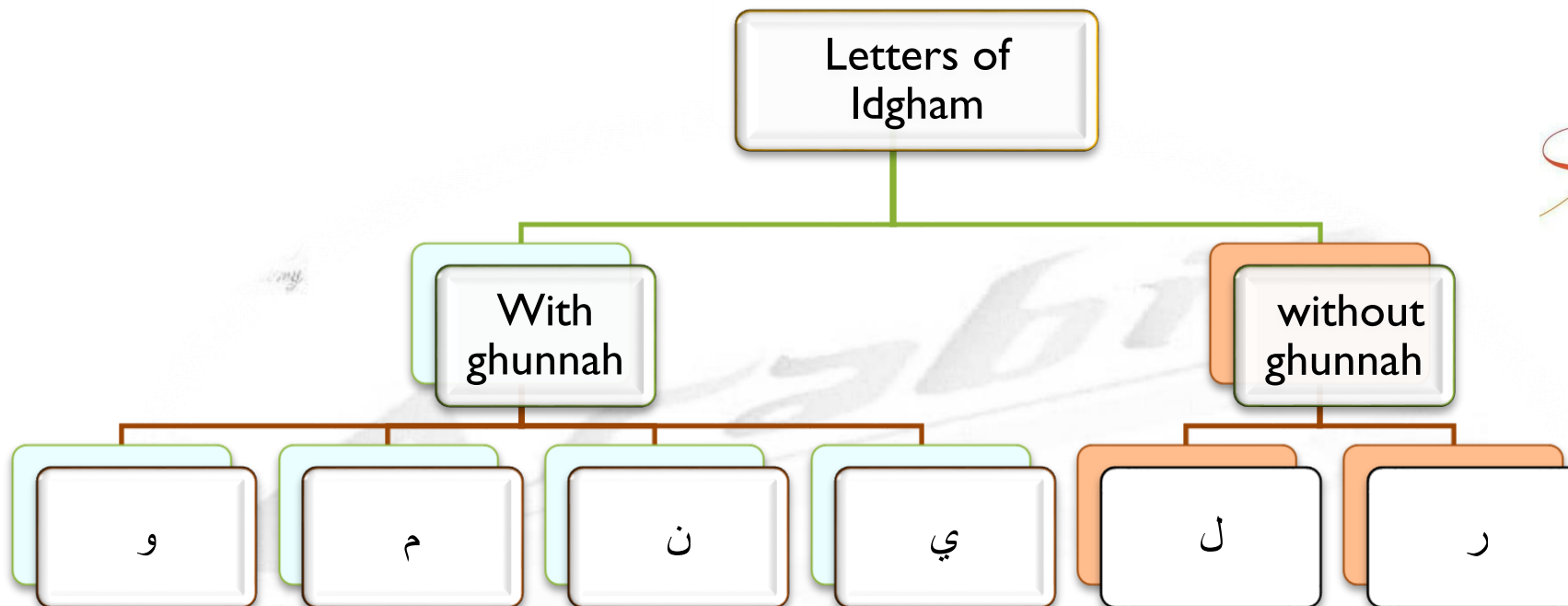


Idgham means “ to merge” the noon sukoon or tanween
mergs into the next letter with or without ghunnah.

Ghunnah

Ghunnah is a nasal sound that goes up into the nasal cavity and exits from the nose .

Idgham with gunnah

ادغام بغنة

- The noon merges into the next letter with a prolonged ghunnah.
- Partially
- ادغام ناقص

Idgham without ghunnah

ادغام بلا غنة

- The noon letter will completely merge into the next letter and there is no left over ghunnah from the noon.
- Complete Idgham
- ادغام كامل

- 2 Make Ghunnah from nose

إخفاء Hiding



إخفاء

Is medium state between izhar and idagham
You should just pronounce ghunnah from the nose without merging and without clarity
