



أَحْكَامُ اللَّامِ السَّاكِنَةِ

Difinition of Laam Sakina

It is a Laam that either appears with a Sukoon or nothing. Laam Sakina rules appear in two different forms as shown below:

Laam Sakina in the form of Ta'reef (definite article): this is where the Laam Sakina appears at the beginning of words. There are two rules here:

الطّهَارٌ قُمَرِيُّ Idhaar Qamari.

الدغَّامٌ شَمَسِيُّ Idghaam Shamsi.

Laam Sakina in other than Ta'reef (definite article) form: this is where the Laam Sakina appears in the middle or at the end of a word. There are also two rules here:

الِدْغَامُ اللَّامِ السَّاكِنَةِ Idghaam Al-Laam As-Sakina. السَّاكِنَةِ السَّاكِنَةِ السَّاكِنَةِ السَّاكِنَةِ

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Laam Sakina in the form of Ta'reef (definite article):

Sakina that appears at the beginning of words in the form of definite article clearly. The Laam Sakina in this case will usually appear with a Sukoon. We will only pronounce this Laam Sakina clearly if any of the following letters appear after the Laam. These letters are known as the Qamari (Moon) letters:

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Laam Sakina in other than Ta'reef (definite article) form:

الدغامُ اللّامِ السَّاكِنَةِ Idghaam Al-Laam As-Sakina: here is where we will merge the Laam Sakina that appears at the end of a word into the letter after it if the following letter is a عن المارية الماري
